#### **Minutes**

The chairperson, Joan welcomed everyone to the meeting, the 2<sup>nd</sup> AGM of the The Irish Forest School Pedagogy Association CLG.

The minutes of the 2024 AGM were presented. They were proposed by LMcM and seconded by SS for approval. Approved unanimously.

Joan delivered the chairperson's report for the period 1 May 2024 to 30 April 2025.

Following the AGM in June 2024, the Board met regularly online and in person online over the course of the year. We continued what has now become a tradition of starting the year with an in-person Day at Lucy's home and land in Co Kildare and again the sun shined on our endeavours. We set out our priorities and shared out the roles for the year ahead. Our approval from the Charities Regulator for the appropriate charitable status, came through on Friday, 31st May (RCN 20206667) so it should be recorded as a milestone for us of the past year. This way of oganising both protects us as Directors of the company and as trustees of the charity and opens up avenues in terms of potential both public and private funding going forward.

Joan thanked her fellow directors/ ACORNs for the huge voluntary effort they put into all IFSA activities on behalf of all our members. She reiterated how the board try to ensure that the values of Forest School are imbued in how we conduct the business of IFSA on your behalf.
